PRESIDENT'S PAGE

The minimal amount of rain experienced in the Taupo catchment has many anglers holding back and waiting for the rainbows runs to be triggered by a major fresh. From the various on-line reports, it is apparent that there has still been some good fishing for those with the skills and persistence to search out the fish. Often in Autumn, the river mouth fishing can be good, and the bonus is the quality of the fish is generally at its best just prior to spawning.

With the low rainfall many of the other main-stem rivers have continued to be productive. A day on the Manawatu yesterday provided over 21 feisty rainbows up to 4lb between two of us, which is to say, the Taupo tributaries are not the only game in town.

Those familiar with fishing the Tongariro River will have noticed the increase in numbers of anglers using techniques such as Euronymphing and Spey casting. With the increased popularity of these techniques has arrived a wider range of equipment to choose from, which is great. The primary benefit however is that it makes a wider range of water available to anglers, helping to reduce the fishing pressure on those pools ideally suited to wet-line or nymph fishing (or budgie fishing as I am inclined to refer it – due to the size of some indicators looking like budgies sitting on the end of a fly-line.)

I will be at Turangi over Queens Birthday weekend and will no doubt be spending some time on the river. As such I will not be available for the Club meeting, but you will be in good hands with Strato giving guidance on Taupo fishing techniques. The Club trips over winter will be based in Turangi. They will provide the perfect opportunity to fish with others and maybe pick up some new skills and learn about different locations to fish.

Please phone Strato 386 3740 and advise if you can help on the day, he can then organise helpers to attend at the most useful times.


POND CLEAN UP - Advance notice.

Truite au Bleu - Blue Trout

The French recipe for Blue Trout is widely known in many European countries, especially in France. It will appear as a main fish dish on many European restaurant menus; throughout Europe we see little variation for preparing this dish. The blue colour of the trout is due to poaching its moist skin which is easily destroyed when scrubbing it too hard. Our recipe derives from Alsace in the Eastern part of France where we frequently spent our holidays.

The recipe feeds two - Preparation (ca 30 mins):

- One large or two medium sized trout, preferably rainbow trout.
- 2 liters of water
- 50 ml. dry white wine
- 2 carrots, sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 big wedge of celeriac, thinly sliced

- 1 leek, sliced into rounds
- 2 bay leaves
- Some pepper corns crushed
- 1 tbsp salt
- 1/8 liter of vinegar
- 20 gr butter
- A bunch of flat parsley
- 1 lemon for serving

You need a big pot (casserole or stock pot) with a lid which holds your trout easily.

Pour in the water, the wine, the salt, the pepper, the garlic, the sliced carrots, the celeriac, leek and the bay leaves, bring to the boil and let it simmer for ca 15 minutes. This will make a good stock.

While cooking the stock, put the trout on a flat dish, bring the vinegar to the boil and pour it on the trout to turn it blue. Then put the trout into the prepared bouillon and cook it softly for about 15 minutes. Towards the end of the cooking time, melt the butter. Place the trout on a warm platter, pour the melted butter over the trout and serve.

Serve with lemon and parsley, boiled potatoes and green salad.

FLY OF THE MONTH

For those who travel to Turangi don't forget that if the weather allows, night fishing can be very productive. Traditional night flies of **Scotch Poacher** and **Craig's Nights** with perhaps a touch of lumo are great options.

CRAIG'S NIGHT-TIME



Hook	TMC 5262 size 2 - 10
Tail	Red wool yarn or synthetic
Rib	Silver oval tinsel or lumo strip
Body	Black chenille
Wing	Pukeko feathers
Hackle	Black hen hackle
Topping	Jungle cock (optional)

Developed around Lake Taupo in the 1930's to suggest the koura (freshwater crayfish) this pattern is still an outstanding trout catcher. The short tail (or tag) accounts for many fish that might be lost through nipping at the tail of a traditional pattern.

This is a very easy to tie pattern and should be present in any night fishers fly box.

SCOTCH POACHER



Hook	TMC 5262 or 5263
HOOK	size 2 – 10
Tail	Black squirrel tail
Rib	Silver oval tinsel
Body	Orange chenille
Wing	Pukeko breast feathers
Hackle	Orange or red
Thread	Black Monocord 3/0

An excellent Taupo lure. Essential for fishing the river mouths on dark winter evenings and into the night. Use it either on its own or as a double rig with a lumo.
