CLUB TRIP TO THE WANGANUI AND WHAKAPAPA

While filled with anticipation of some good conditioned large rainbows trips can also be disappointing.

The rainbows run up the Whakapapa River to spawn and for this reason the river is closed to fishing from the end of June.

Last year's trip which was held in March, was disappointing and only a few fish were caught.

This year we delayed the trip to May in the hope it would be more successful but reports received from other anglers prior to the trip were not all that positive.

Five of us made the journey and travelled to the Taumaranui Motor Camp where we had booked the Kiwi Cabin.



Arriving midday Friday we decided to fish the Wanganui close to the camp but we only had a 1 kilo brown to show for our efforts.



Saturday was spent fishing Stone Jug Road on the Whakapapa, which is a favourite with anglers but our efforts were to no avail.



A transfer to the Te Rena Road Reserve in the afternoon however resulted in six hook ups but the fighting qualities of these Whakapapa rainbows resulted in only three coming to the net.

Other anglers who had fished that area in the morning had had some success so we were fishing some of the waters second hand.



That night we were lucky and saw the Aurora lights in a spectacular display.

Sunday morning we decided to return to the Reserve where the previous day a few fish were caught in the stretch of water which required some tricky river crossings where a wading stick was imperative. A 6 lb rainbow jack was the highlight of one angler's day and yells and smiles of success from two who caught two nice 5-6lb fish in the area close to the car park, at least gave extra satisfaction to some in our group.

All the rainbows caught were resident fish and were not part of the spawning run.



Perhaps next year we may delay the trip to June. Strato

FLY OF THE MONTH

Fly tying is sponsored by Fishscene



Monday 17 June, 7.30pm - Tararua Tramping Club Locker Room (Access through side door on north side of building)

This month's fly is a SCOTCH POACHER.

An excellent Taupo lure. Essential for fishing the river mouths on dark winter evenings and into the night. Use it either on its own or as a double rig with a lumo.



Fish on or near the bottom with sink-tip or sinking lines.

Materials

Hook	TMC 5262 or 5263 size 2 – 10
Thread	Black Monocord 3/0
Tail	Black squirrel tail
Rib	Silver oval tinsel
Body	Orange Chenille
Wing	Pukeko breast feathers
Hackle	Orange or red
